



# ENGLISH PARISH PRECEPTS 2018/19

The Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) has published details of the precepts issued by all parish councils in England for 2018/19. Comparable figures for Wales are not currently available. There are currently 10,194 parishes in England (three more than last year) of whom 8,839 issued a precept. The total of all precepts was £518.286M and the average at Band D was £64.05, an increase of £3.02 or 4.9% on the previous year.
